

Fuelwood Cutting

A Fort Riley Fuelwood Permit is required and must be carried at all times when cutting wood. Permits can be obtained (cost is \$20.00) directly from the Fort Riley iSportsman website.

- The Fuelwood Permit is valid for ninety (90) days, from the date of purchase, and is good for TWO cords of wood. (One cord is a stack that is 4 feet high by 4 feet tall by 8 feet long.)
- All fuelwood cutters must check-out and check-in on the iSportsman site each day they choose to cut.
- Both Military Personnel and the General Public are welcome to purchase Fort Riley Fuelwood Permits. ONLY dead and down wood may be cut. DO NOT cut standing timber. Wood obtained from Fort Riley under a Fuelwood permit may NOT be traded, bartered or sold.
- All woodcutters must display a Fort Riley Recreational Vehicle Marker.
- Driving off road to gain access to fuelwood is allowed by permitted fuelwood cutters.
- Fuelwood locations are set by the Public Works Conservation Branch and posted at the Outdoor Recreation Center and the Conservation Branch office, 407 Pershing Court.

TREE SPECIES THAT RELEASE THE MOST AMOUNT OF HEAT:

- Osage-orange (Hedge)
- Black locust
- Hickory
- Honey Locust
- Mulberry

TREE SPECIES THAT RELEASE A MODERATE AMOUNT OF HEAT:

- Oak
- Green Ash
- Walnut
- Kentucky Coffee tree
- Hackberry
- Elm
